

## Official Team Composition Regulations

# **EIFLEAGUE – Euro Immigrants Football League**

This regulation establishes the official rules for the composition of squads participating in all championships, tournaments, and competitions organised by **EIFLEAGUE**. Its purpose is to guarantee inclusion, diversity, and the fair representation of immigrant communities.

## 1. General Team Composition

Each team may register up to 12 players, as follows:

- 8 players of the team's principal nationality;
- Up to 3 players of other nationalities (foreign players);
- Up to 1 invited player from the local community (British/English).

#### 2. Inclusion of Youth Players (Under-18)

- Each team must register 2 players under the age of 18.
- At least one under-18 player must be on the pitch during matches.

## 3. Intercultural Integration

- Among the 3 permitted players from outside the team's principal nationality, it is recommended that
  they represent different continents or cultural backgrounds, in order to promote multicultural
  exchange.
- Players must be residents in Europe and have active links with immigrant communities.

# 4. Inclusion of a Professional Player

• Each team may register up to 1 player with previous experience in professional clubs or semiprofessional leagues in the lower divisions (up to the 4th division) of the host country.

#### 5. Penalties for Non-Compliance

• Failure to comply with these rules may result in the deduction of points, annulment of matches, or disqualification of the team, as determined by the organising committee.

## 6. Final Provisions

This regulation applies to all official EIFLEAGUE competitions.

Its objective is to ensure that tournaments are fair, diverse, and representative of the multicultural richness of Europe's immigrant communities.

# **CHAPTER VII – FINAL PROVISIONS**

This Statute enters into force on the date of its approval. Amendments may only be made by the management of EIFLEAGUE LTD through formal registration. Any cases not covered herein will be resolved by the organising committee.
